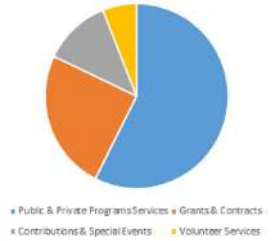

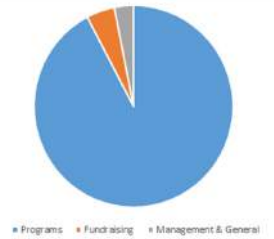
Revenue: \$1,827,548

My name is Leona Gamerl, and I've been volunteering for AGE since 2008.

My mother was diagnosed with dementia last summer. Mom and Dad live in Laguna Beach, CA, around the corner from my brother and sister-in-law. Thankfully at 83 years of age, Mom's in the mild stage. It's unclear whether she has Alzheimer's, but with her progression, albeit a slow one, her providers are thinking so.



She is amazing! She's the kindest person I know, the best storyteller, and can still cook, walk downtown to yoga three days-a-week and back by herself, and still drives (so far). She and Dad (he's 79) walk around the neighborhood daily. They've made it easy for my siblings and me as far as their health.

Thanks to AGE, my parents have benefited from the seminar content I've had the pleasure to attend. They have revised their will, have advanced directives, have begun to discuss more openly memory loss and care options, etc. They are even considering moving to Texas near me in the next 2-3 years...in which case, I will plug them into AGE as soon as they step foot here.
