AGE of Central Texas is once again partnering with the Pflugerville Community Church to host the **Pflugerville Seniors Conference** on Thursday, May 10th, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. This free annual

community event features area experts discussing aging-related topics that include paying for longterm care, financial and legal issues, and driving safely as you age.

Check-in will begin at

9:00 a.m. with a light breakfast and the Resource & Information Fair. Then from 10:00 a.m. to noon, participants will rotate between two informative one-hour breakout sessions (see below).

At noon, participants will be able to again visit the extensive Resource & Information Fair prior to the complimentary lunch. During lunch, Julia Davies from the Baylor Scott & White Health's Mature Driver Program will present "We Need to Talk," an informative session that will discuss the impact of aging on driving skills, driving behaviors of mature drivers, warning signs of an unsafe driver, and how to talk to a loved one about

safety concerns.

This state-wide driving program is a collaboration between Hillcrest Regional Trauma Services and the Texas Department of Transportation, and strives to reduce crashes, injuries,

and fatalities among adult drivers.

The first breakout session features **Michael Gill**, President of Texas Senior Living Locators, who will discuss options that older adult can utilize to pay for long-term care options. Michael is widely considered one of the leading regional experts in senior living options, and he has an extensive

knowledge of Veterans benefits, home health care, non-medical home care, geriatric care management, long-term care insurance, senior real estate specialists, senior movers, and a myriad of other Central Texas-area senior adult services.



For the second breakout session, Central Texas elder care lawyer **G. Gaye Thompson** will provide an overview of the legal documents that every senior adult needs to have. She has been licensed to practice before the United States Supreme Court, the Fifth Circuit Court, the United States District

Court for the Western District of Texas, and the Supreme Court of Texas. She is also a Veterans Administration-accredited attorney and has been listed in the 2007-2015 editions of "Best Lawyers in America" in Elder Law.

The free seminar is sponsored by the Austin Senior Resource Alliance.

Paul Zambie from the Texas Legal Services Center will give direction to senior adults and family careivers on how to prepare an advanced directive and the strategies to use with their attorney. Advance directives are legal documents that allow a person to convey their decisions about end-of-life care in advance.

These documents provide a way to communicate final wishes to family, friends, and health care professionals, and to avoid confusion later on, and are also useful to avoid having to probate a will, ensuring that debts against an estate can be paid and assets can be transferred to the beneficiaries.
